The El Paso County Bar Foundation announced its 2019 grants to four non-profit organizations serving the El Paso and Teller County communities. Grants totaling \$13,000 were made to the following four applicants:

Grant recipients will use the funds to serve one or more of the Bar Foundation's charitable and educational purposes listed below:

- Promote education, knowledge and awareness of the law.
- Improve the administration of justice and the delivery of legal services.
- Assist in providing legal services to those who are unable to afford them.
- Provide scholarships and grants consistent with these purposes.
- Serve similar charitable and community needs in El Paso and Teller Counties.

The Bar Foundation was established in 2002 as the charitable arm of the El Paso County Bar Association. It is a nonprofit corporation organized under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. In addition to awarding grants, the Bar Foundation, in partnership with the Joseph Henry Edmonson Foundation, the Coulter Foundation, and the El Pomar Foundation, awards two scholarships annually—the Ruth Rouss Scholarship for women and the Ben Wendelken Scholarship for men—to law students who intend to practice law in the Pikes Peak Region following graduation.
